Brahman is worshipped in many names and forms called Murtis.

- Murtis symbolize ideals and invoke devotion.
- They do not have to be human forms only.
- Symbols carry significant meaning.

Many names and forms; one Source .. pluriform monotheistic .. Rest your mind in God "by any means whatsoever"

Brahman: No form, no attributes; indescribable but can be experienced **Ishwara**: No form, has attributes: all-knowing, all powerful, eternal etc. **Deity** (Bhagavan/Bhagavati/Devata/Devi): Has form, has attributes helpful in connecting with the all powerful higher being that is the One ultimate reality

Six special attributes (bhaga):

- knowledge, detachment, sovereignty, righteousness, renown, glory Seen as presiding over cosmic forces and forces within us; can incarnate
