Varna: Four temperaments; not by birth; mentioned in Hindu scriptures; no hierarchy and all equally important

Jati: Family lineage; by birth; thousands in number; societal grouping based on occupation; similar to guild system

Varna is best defined as "inherent qualities"



Over 3000 *Jatis* exist in India as societal groups based on occupation



Caste is Social not Religious

Caste system: The oppressive practice of grouping jatis into four varnas is a social practice that is not based on religion; confounds varna and jati; imposes hierarchy on varnas; illegal as per Indian constitution

Many Hindu reformers have sought to abolish caste discrimination in India

Many Hindu sages were not born in Brahmin families
